III. EDITION IMPRESSIONS

1. FIRST EDITION

The plate in good condition.

Fine grain aquatint, in one pale tone; contrasts fairly well with the highlights on the bull.

Over-bitten etched lines print weakly.

2-3. SECOND AND THIRD EDITIONS

The plate in fair condition.

Aquatint wears gradually; the highlight on the bull retains its contast.

4-7. FOURTH TO SEVENTH EDITIONS.

The plate in poor condition.

Aquatint prints without grain; the highlight on the bull loses its contrast. Etching prints well throughout except in the over-bitten areas at the bottom of the cape next to the bull's neck.
